EASTER VIGIL – 8 P.M.* – CHURCH EASTER SUNDAY, APRIL 4TH 7:30, 9:00, 10:30* AND 12 NOON – CHURCH *INCENSE USED Is 50:4-7: The servant was persecuted and struck by his own people; he was spit upon and beaten. He proclaims the true faith and suffers to atone for the sins of his people. Here we see a foreshadowing of the true servant of God.

Phil 2:6-11: Paul urges us to humility by which we are made like to Christ, our Lord, who, putting off the majesty of His divinity, became man and humbled himself in obedience to the ignominious death of the cross.

Mk 14:1 - 15-47: Mark recounts the events that led up to the betrayal of Jesus and His final condemnation — His death on the cross. At the Last Supper, Jesus institutes the Holy Eucharist.

Today's Message: Jesus, humbling himself out of love for us, did not shield His face from buffets and spitting, but offered His life on the cross. He relied on His Father's love.
