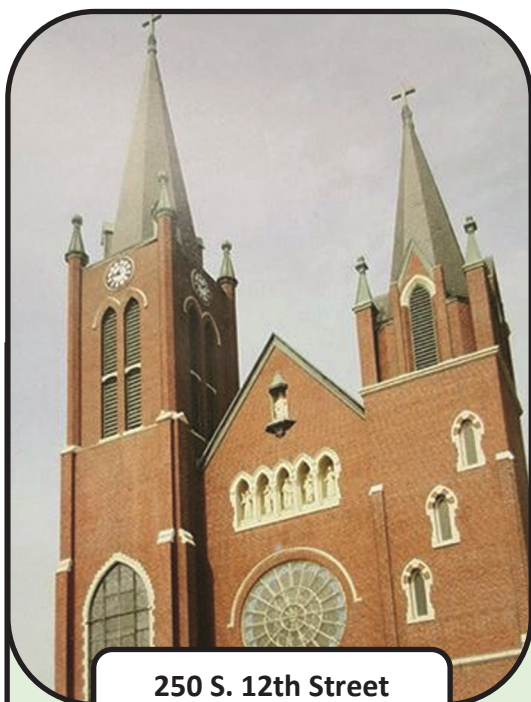

READY TO RE-DIRECT YOUR PENNSYLVANIA INCOME TAX DOLLARS TO CATHOLIC EDUCATION?

The Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) and Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit (OSTC) programs provide tax credits to eligible individuals contributing to the Eastern Pennsylvania Scholarship Foundation (EPSF), a charitable trust started by the Diocese of Allentown over twenty years ago. Individual's contributions are then used by EPSF to provide tuition assistance in the form of scholarships to eligible students attending schools within the Diocese of Allentown, including **ST. CATHARINE OF SIENA SCHOOL**.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Tax credits may be applied against the state tax liability of an individual for the tax year in which the contribution was made. For a two-year commitment an individual taxpayer can receive a 90% tax credit.


